# **IBE First-Year Course Registration Guide**

#### **Overview**

Registration for First Year Students for the Fall Semester will be July 21st - July 31st. **IBE Students will register on July 21st at 10:00 am.** 

- → Registration is facilitated each semester by the Office of the Registrar
  - **♦** This guide and the First-Year Student Enrollment (FYS) website (fysenroll.lehigh.edu) will be key resources for you to prepare to register.
  - ◆ <u>Banner</u> is the platform used for registration.
  - ◆ You will create a <u>Plan Ahead</u> to use on the day of registration by using the resources available to you
    - You must share your plan with your advisor prior to registration.

#### **ALEKS Calculus Placement Exam**

The <u>ALEKS placement exam</u> is used to place you into the appropriate calculus course You can take the exam up to 5 times and must wait 48 hours between attempts

- → If you are <u>not</u> anticipating credit for calculus, you <u>MUST</u> take the exam.
- → If you are anticipating credit for calculus you don't have to take the exam
  - ♦ *However*, it is suggested that <u>ALL</u> students take ALEKS to ensure that you feel adequately prepared for taking calculus at Lehigh. You can discuss this further with your advisor if you have questions.

#### **Transfer Credit**

If you do not send your scores and/or transcripts in a timely manner, it will impact your ability to register for appropriate courses on the day of registration.

AP/IB scores required to earn credit are viewable on the FYS website You can review awarded transfer credit on your transcript

#### **Sending Scores/Transcripts**

- AP Scores // Lehigh (code 002365)
- IB Scores // Send transcript directly to Office of the Registrar
- <u>Dual Enrollment Transfer Credit</u> Process to pursue credit is on FYS website

# **Important Steps to Prepare for Registration**

Activate your Lehigh account and email address in May	
Read through ALL sections of the IBE First-Year Course Registration Guide	
Review the information on the First-Year Student Enrollment (FYS) Website	
( <u>fysenroll.lehigh.edu</u> )	
Monitor your email for communications from your advisor	
Review awarded transfer credit prior to creating your plan	
Create your Plan Ahead to use on the day of registration. If you have questions or	
concerns you can discuss them with your advisor when you meet with them.	
o If you would prefer to meet with your advisor prior to making your plan, you have that	
option as well. It is expected that you have reviewed the resources available to you prior	
to the meeting.	
Schedule a one-on-one meeting with your advisor to go over your Plan Ahead	
Be sure to accept the <u>Bursar's Financial Responsibility agreement</u> before	
registration opens. It only takes a moment, but could delay you on the day of	
registration as it pops up before you can access the registration system	
Be prepared to register on July 21st at 10:00. As a student in an honors	
program, you get to register a day earlier than most other students SO TAKE	
ADVANTAGE OF THIS. Delaying registration may cause unnecessary	
difficulties to get into classes that would've been avoided if you've taken	
advantage of the priority registration you have as an IBE student	

# **Sample IBE Schedule**

Below is a *sample* of what your schedule may look like for your first-year, it can vary based on transfer credit or discussions you have with your advisor.

IBE 010 (1): IBE Freshman Seminar	IBE 050 (3): IBE Freshman Workshop
PHY 011 (4): Introductory Physics I  Must be taken concurrently with MATH 021  Credit for PHY 011: Take CHM 030  Credit for PHY 011 & MATH 022: Take PHY 021 or CHM 030  Credit for PHY 011, PHY 021, CHM 030: Discuss with advisor	CHM 030 (4): Introduction to Chemical Principles PHY 021 cannot be taken concurrently with MATH 022 like PHY 011 can.
PHY 012 (1): Introductory Physics I (Lab)	ENGR 010 (3): Applied Engineering Computer Methods
MATH 021 (4): Calculus I Or MATH 075 (2): Calculus I, Part A	MATH 022 (4): Calculus II Or MATH 076 (2): Calculus I, Part B
Math 075 & 76 is Calculus I split into two terms, may be suggested based on your ALEKS placement exam scores	Only take MATH 076 this term if you started in MATH 075 in the Fall.
Credit for MATH 021: Take MATH 022 Credit for MATH 021 & 022: Take MATH 023, or discuss with advisor. You may benefit from adjusting to rigor at Lehigh and plan to take in Spring term as MATH 023 is known to be challenging course	
WRT 001 (3): Academic & Analytical Writing Or WRT 003 (3): Composition & Literature I for Multilingual Writers IBE students do not take WRT 002	MGT 043 (3): Organizational Behavior
Credit for WRT 001: Take MGT 043, ENGR 010, or BUAN 044	
ECO 001 (4): Principles of Economics  Credit for ECO 001: Take MGT 043 or BUAN 044	BUS 003 (1.5): Business Communications I Or BUAN 044 (1.5): Business Analytics I

**NOTE:** ENGR 010 is changing from (2) to (3) credits starting in the Fall 2025 academic year. This *may* require you to overload credits by 0.5 to 1 credit in your first year, preferably your Spring semester. If this ends up being the case, you would discuss the overload process with your advisor.

## Tips to create a Plan Ahead

Make a list of courses that you plan to register for based on the information provided to you and discussions with your advisor

Registering for your courses in the suggested order below may make it easier to build your schedule. This is just a guide, and you don't have to register in this order.

- 1. IBE Freshman Seminar, IBE 010
- 2. PHY 011 and the lab PHY 012
- 3. ECO 001
- 4. MATH 021
- 5. WRT 001
- **Linked Courses:** Physics (or Chemistry), Economics, and Calculus are rostered as <u>linked</u> <u>courses</u>, so there are two different components of the class you need to register for. Only certain lectures go with certain recitations.
  - Pick your preferred lecture, then click "view linked," to pick a corresponding linked recitation. If you pick two sections at random, they may not be linked together.
  - Linked courses are indicated by this icon.



- Common hour exams: occasionally, common hour exams can conflict with each other. If this happens, you'd have to reach out to either academic department and request a time conflict override to register. One of the departments should work with you to get into the classes. You can consult with your advisor about this if needed.
- Course Restrictions: Plan Ahead may have a message indicating that there are restrictions on the course. This is just a general message that lets you know there are restrictions placed on the course, but they may not necessarily apply to you. You have the ability to check what these restrictions are though.
- Get in the habit of checking course restrictions and prerequisites every time you make a plan!
  - You can check course restrictions by clicking on the course title when viewing the schedule and reviewing the "restrictions" and "prerequisites" tab.
  - You should not run into issues with this if you are following the sample schedule but if you have considerable transfer credit you may run into course restrictions on upper level classes.

# **General Information**

- You are welcome to contact your advisor at any time if you have questions or would just like to meet them prior to working on your Plan Ahead.
- To get an idea of the expected workload in your classes, consider utilizing the <u>Weekly Course Commitments Tool</u>, which provides student reported data on the average time spent in the classroom & outside of class on assignments and studying.
- A recitation is a review period for material covered in class and is a component of many core classes.
- 100-level classes you typically need sophomore standing in order to register for them
- Lehigh University follows an <u>academic calendar</u>, it is suggested to bookmark this page as it contains important dates for each academic term
  - The first two weeks of the Fall/Spring semesters are known as the add/drop period where you still change your schedule. The second week of classes requires instructor approval in order to add classes.
- You may hear that you need a 6-digit PIN to register, but this is incorrect you will NOT need a PIN for your first registration cycle as an incoming student. If you need to make changes to your schedule in August, you will need to contact your academic advisor as PINs will be applied to student records on August 1st.
  - Every semester moving forward you must discuss your planned courses with an advisor in order to receive your PIN for registration. A unique PIN is generated for every term of registration.

- Degree requirements for the IBE degree and each major are available in the <u>university catalog</u>
- Your <u>Degree Audit</u> will help you keep track of your curriculum requirements. It is not needed for registration in July, but will be utilized starting in your Fall semester. You can feel free to explore this resource at any time though.
- The Lehigh University Directory is a helpful tool for finding department contacts.
  - o If you need assistance from a contact at Lehigh, it is recommended that you provide your Lehigh Identification Number (LIN#) and specific course information (if it pertaining to getting into a course)
